


### What is UNITAR?

### **UNITAR's Beneficiary and Event Statistics**




### Global outreach



# The SymbioCity Approach: a framework for holistic and sustainable urban development


SymbioCity is a fast track to holistic and sustainable urban development.



### A tool seeking to develop synergies between subsystems




### **SymbioCity**
